

Math and English Hub

The hub provides targeted support for students who need help improving their functional and academic skills. The hub promotes independent learning and helps students strengthen the core skills.

Learning Resource Centre

Students receive an induction on the Student Intranet, Microsoft Teams, and the platforms used throughout the college for learning, communication, and accessing key resources. They are provided with login credentials to access the college network and can use computers available across all areas of the campus. These platforms are also accessible from home.

Access to Computers

The Learning Resources Centre (LRC) at Isleworth is fully equipped to support academic success. It offers access to books, journals, DVDs, e-resources, and both PC and Mac computers. Quiet study zones and helpful staff are available to support students with research, revision, and assignment writing. By using the LRC, students develop essential academic and digital literacy skills.

Sexual health and relationships

College ID Card

"All students are issued a College ID card, which **must be worn and clearly visible at all times** while on site. Entry to the campus is not permitted without a valid ID, and students must show their card when requested by staff. This helps us keep everyone safe and maintain a secure learning environment

Tutorial support

Every student is supported by a dedicated Tutor or Student Learning Adviser (SLA) who monitors attendance, progress, and personal development with regular one-to-one meetings

Absence from class

Students must notify the Curriculum Administrator the moning of their class and inform their SLA on return. Avoid holidays and non-urgent appointments during term time.

Examination support and access arrangements

In line with the latest regulations from the Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ), access arrangements are provided for students with a long-term learning difficulty, disability, or medical condition that significantly affects their exam performance. These arrangements are based on the student's normal way of working in the classroom and are intended to reflect the support they routinely receive.

Reasonable adjustments

If the student requires reasonable adjustments, such as extra time, a reader, a scribe, or assistive technology, students must declare their support needs to either the Inclusion Team or the Exams Office **before December.** This allows sufficient time to gather the necessary evidence and submit it to the awarding bodies for approval.

Additional adjustments

In line with the Equality Act 2010, may also be available, but these must be requested well in advance to ensure they can be implemented appropriately.

Please note:

All adjustments must uphold the integrity of the examination process. For example, if a student qualifies for certain arrangements, they may be required to sit their exam in a smaller, separate room. We also remind all students and parents that the college has clear rules regarding dress and conduct during examinations, which are published on our website.
