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Advice from a former police chief constable

Uniformed Public Services students met former Kent Police Chief Constable, Michael Fuller, as part of Black History Month.



Michael joined the Metropolitan Police at 16, at a time when there were only six black police officers out of 30,000. He faced many challenges including police corruption, racism and violent criminal gangs, though he was keen to stress that the situation has improved and there was also a strong sense of comradery with his colleagues.

Michael gave our students an insight into his strategies for succeeding in a difficult environment.

- Hard work. He was prepared to do jobs that others were not in order to build his credibility in the team.
- Self-awareness. Michael made a point of understanding his strengths and weaknesses and working to develop his skills and knowledge. Achieving an MBA and a law degree enabled him to progress in the police force.

Our uniformed public services courses can lead into careers not only in the Metropolitan Police, but also in the armed forces, fire department, in MI5 or as a paramedic. Residential trips form an essential part of these courses and can include scuba diving, camping, orienteering or abseiling.

Since September, the Logistics Skills Alliance (LSA), hosted by the college, has really gathered momentum.

Two summits, a business breakfast, a successful partnership with Job Centre Plus have brought learners, providers and employers together to address the needs of an industry sector – transport and logistics – that continues to grow and provide a wide range of employment opportunities. Over 250 jobseekers have taken up training in warehousing and storage and forklift truck operations at our Skills+Logistics Centre in Feltham. For many this has provided a direct route into work – our links with employers such as Kuehne and Nagel, Geodis, UPS, and D B Schenker have ensured that training being delivered and developed by the LSA is up to date and prepares adults and young people for the world of work.

From April this year, we are offering a short course for young people at the Skills+Logistics Centre and from September there will be a Level 2 full-time course.
