Students and staff celebrated the cultural diversity of our college community at the Isleworth campus as part of **Commonwealth Big Lunches**.



At West Thames College we help all our students to complete work experience placements whilst on their course.

Work experience helps you practice the skills you learn in the classroom and looks great on your CV when you apply for university or a job.

Students from our FreshStart programme for 14-16 year olds had a taste of employment and a chance to try out careers which they might like to pursue in the future.

Nicola Root worked at Hair @ DJ's in Brentford, looking after clients, making tea and coffee, shampooing hair and trying out hairdressing techniques. Owner Donna Padbury was so impressed by Nicola that she offered her a full-time apprenticeship starting in September.

Jack Cummings had a placement at Tanner Gas Services where he helped to exchange gas meters. Despite snowy weather conditions, he arrived early every day. His positive attitude meant that he was offered extra work over the Easter holidays with a view to an apprenticeship in the future.

Meanwhile, painting and decorating students undertook work experience over Easter to refresh the FreshStart area at the Isleworth campus and paint the foyer at the Skills+Logistics Centre. The work was supervised by lecturer David Bennett and assessed for the students' qualification.
